
MAKING CONNECTIONS IDENTIFYING WORK-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES IN YOUR COMMUNITY

BUILDING THE PIPELINE

With the passage of Act 77, the Flexible Pathways Initiative, the State of Vermont has made career development a priority for the public education of Vermont's youth. To support the initiative, the Agency of Education created a Career Development Progression to help inform Vermont's students and employers of work-based learning opportunities that start as early as kindergarten.

The State's progression aligns closely with the Talent Pipeline Management Value Model, developed by the U.S. Chamber Foundation, which has been adopted by the Vermont Talent Pipeline Management (VTPM) project. The Vermont Business Roundtable's College and Career Readiness Task Force supports both, and encourages VBR members and other business leaders to explore collaboration opportunities with schools in their communities.
